Victorian Traffic Controller wins coveted award!

Bradley Timothy from Traffic Diversions Group has become the second traffic controller from Victoria to take out the Traffic Controller of the Year Quarterly Award.

Bradley's award is for the December quarter and means he will travel to Sydney in March to vie for the overall National Traffic Controller of the Year Award at the Traffic Management Association of Australia Conference.

The Traffic Management Association of Australia, (TMAA), and Kennards Hire first launched this award in 2014 to highlight the outstanding work provided by traffic controllers around the country, in one of the most dangerous industries.

Of winning the award, Bradley said he was shocked and thrilled. "I came to traffic control from a factory environment, so working in the outdoors has been a great change although it can be a dangerous role."

Bradley said he most enjoyed managing the safety of clients and the public but expressed concerns that often people did not obey the signs on traffic control sites.

"My message to the public is "Respect the signs and the respect the people working within those signs"."

"I think one of the best ways to improve the industry is to have even more structured training for newcomers to the industry as the job itself varies from site to site and managing big crews is one of the hardest things across a site," he said.

The National Traffic Controller of the Year Awards and are held quarterly with an annual winner announced in March this year.
