# Associate Group Status

- A person, firm, corporation, association, or institution carrying on business or has an interest in the Traffic Control Industry may be eligible for Associate Status if they satisfy the requirements of TMAA Rule 5.4.
- The TMAA Associate Group status is specifically reserved to Council or Government departments.
- An Associate Group may nominate one representative to represent their interests with the Organisation for any twelve (12) month period of their Associate Status.
- An Associate Group will not have the right to vote at a General Meeting of the Organisation.
- An Associate Group will have the right to attend and participate in all General Meetings of the Organisation.
- The number of Associate Groups is unlimited.
- An Associate Group will be required to pay an Associate fee as set out on the TMAA website.

#### Associate status may be cancelled if:

- Associate is found to be non-compliant in the areas of governance (ATO, etc.) or Associate Criteria and does not rectify within 3 months.
- Enters into Receivership or Bankruptcy.
- Brings the TMAA into disrepute, whether by action or inaction.
- Associate fees are not paid by due date.

*Note: No compensation will be paid for part Associate Status if Associate Status has been cancelled.* 

Trading terms in relation to any Associate fees is strictly 14 days from date of invoice.
