ASSOCIATE ORGANISATIONS



Associate Status

- ✓ A Company, or other body or individual who provides a service to the Organisation may be eligible for Associate Status if they satisfy the requirements of Rule 4. Such companies may include industry related companies, associations or relevant bodies working strategically with the Traffic Control Industry.
- ✓ An Associate organisation may nominate one representative to represent their interests with the Organisation for any twelve (12) month period of their Associate Status.
- ✓ An Associate organisation will not have the right to vote at a General Meeting of the Organisation.
- ✓ An Associate Organisation will have the right to attend and participate in all General Meetings of the Organisation.
- ✓ The number of Associate Organisations is unlimited.
- ✓ An Associate Organisation will be required to pay an Associate fee as set out in the TMAA Rules.

Associate benefits include:

- ✓ Brand alignment and use of TMAA logo for tendering, marketing
- ✓ Relationship alignment with contractors, government (national, state and local), key stakeholders and road authorities
- ✓ Relevant industry and government communiques, quarterly magazine
- ✓ Fully dedicated National Board, EO
- ✓ Representation of traffic control sector to local, state and Federal government and media
- ✓ Educational and networking opportunities including Conferences and state events
- ✓ Recognition as an Associate of a peak professional body
- ✓ Industry events and meeting calendar for all Divisions
- ✓ Invitations to industry and related industry events
- ✓ Continued professional development through TMAA and affiliated approved events and access to industry professionals and speakers
- ✓ Sponsorship opportunities, event hosting and brand exposure (for Associate suppliers)
- ✓ Access to legislative changes and legal updates


ASSOCIATE STATUS MAY BE CANCELLED IF:

- Associate is found to be non-compliant in the areas of governance (ATO, etc.) or Associate Criteria and does not rectify within 3 months.
- Enters into Receivership or Bankruptcy.
- Brings the TMAA into disrepute, whether by action or inaction.
- Associate fees are not paid by due date.

No compensation will be paid for part Associate Status if Associate Status has been cancelled.

ASSOCIATE CRITERIA

- Business Name Certificate/Organisations must provide services or be affiliated with the traffic management industry
- Registered ABN or ACN (evidence to be provided, certificate copy or extract)
- Is not a Sham Arrangement
- Applicants are required to provide full details of their business
- Promote a culture of continuous improvement within the industry
- Agree to support, abide by and promote the objectives of the TMAA
- Requires each Associate to have at one representative registered on the TMAA register as an Associate representative.
- Have representative attend either in person or via conference call General Meetings as held in states or territories and nationally.

An invoice for Associate fees will be issued on formal approval and acceptance by the TMAA Committee of Management. Trading terms in relation to any Associate fees is strictly 14 days from date of invoice. All Associates are 1 year (pro rata).
